This Week's Kingdom Quest Lesson:

Take Home Point:
God set you apart to do something special for him.

Drive Time Home

Tickler Question: Show me what you made that reminds you of some of the ways God might use you to share his love with others. *(Kids decorated a paper "travel bag" with ways they could see that God might use them.)*

Select questions and adapt for your family.

God Time at Home

FOR STARTERS: Each person answer: "Someday, I would like to..." (Example: I would like to learn how to golf, or travel to Disney Land, or become an astronaut.) Say: "These goals might be described as a "mission" to do something. God has given us all a mission. He has set us apart to do something special for him. Let's talk about what that might be."

READ THE BIBLE: Acts 12:24-13:33

KEY VERSE: 1 Peter 4:10, *"Each of you as a good manager must use the gift God has given you to serve others."*

TALK ABOUT IT: According to Acts 13:2, who set Barnabas and Paul apart for God's service? *(The Holy Spirit.)* In Acts 13:4, who sent Paul and Barnabas to the island of Cyprus? *(The Holy Spirit.)* How do you think Paul knew Elymas was from the devil? *(Acts 13:9. Paul was filled with the Holy Spirit.)* How did the governor respond when he saw how Paul recognized this man as a false prophet and caused him to become blind? *(Acts 13:12. He believed, and the Lord's teachings amazed him.)* In Acts 13:13-31, Paul shares the Good News. What is this Good News as summarized in Acts 13:32-33? *("What God promised our ancestors has happened. God has fulfilled the promise for us, their descendants, by bringing Jesus back to life.")* Who will call you apart for God's service? *(The Holy Spirit.)* How do you think you will know it is him? What are some gifts the Holy Spirit has given you to use to serve God and others?

PRAYER POWER: Thank God for the Good News of Jesus. Thank God that he has set each of us apart and equipped us for his service. Pray that all would listen to the promptings of the Holy Spirit and be obedient to his calling.
