



# God Talk At Home

**This Week's Kingdom Quest Lesson:**  
Paul Goes to the Gentiles

**Take Home Point:**  
God wants to reach people of all nations—we can help.

## Drive Time Home

Tickler Question: Explain to me your take home project, "Friendship Door." (*The door lists some people who may be unlikely friends. We don't want to close the friendship door to these people.*)

*Select questions and adapt for your family.*

## God Time at Home

**FOR STARTERS:** Ask: "Who are some of your good friends and why?" Then ask: "Who are some people not very likely to be your friends?" Then conclude: "Let's think about how God might use us to help people who are likely not to be our friends."

**READ THE BIBLE:** Acts 13:44-14:28

**KEY VERSES:** Romans 10:12-13, "There is no difference between Jews and Greeks. They all have the same Lord, who gives his riches to everyone who prays to him. So then, 'Whoever prays in the name of the Lord will be saved.'"

**TALK ABOUT IT:** What happened while Paul and Barnabas were in the city of Iconium? (*Acts 14:1-5. They preached to a large crowd of Jews and Greeks. Some people believed and others refused. Some of them even planned to stone Paul and Barnabas to death.*) To what other cities did Paul and Barnabas go to share the news of Jesus? (*Lystra, Antioch, Derbe, Pisidia, Pamphylia, Perga and Attalia.*) Which people mostly believed? (*The non-Jewish people.*) Who then will be saved? (*All who pray in the name of the Lord, regardless of race or status.*) What lessons can we learn from Paul and Barnabas' visits to other cities? (*Some people will always reject the news of Jesus and will often try to keep others from accepting it. We need to continue to share the love of Jesus even if others don't accept it. Some will.*) Should we let that discourage us? Why not? Should we close the door of friendship to others even if they close it to us? Why or why not?

**PRAYER POWER:** Thank God that he opened the door of friendship to us through the death and resurrection of Jesus. Pray that all might keep the door of friendship open to others even if rejected. Pray for the power of the Holy Spirit to stay encouraged when rejected. Have family members pray for specific individuals God would want them to be friends with.
