Small Group Warm-Up

- small bucket of dirt
- styrofoam or paper cup

Large Group

- sack or box
- three or four apples
- knife
- Gordy puppet

Small Group Warm-Up

- drinking straw
- 20 feet of kite string or fishing line
- a deflated balloon that can expand to between five and seven inches
- masking tape
- marker

Large Group Presentation

- Gordy
- an inflated balloon with a straw attached to it like in small group warm-up but NOT attached to the string track
- a string track pulled tightly from behind Gordy's window (See small group warm-up.)

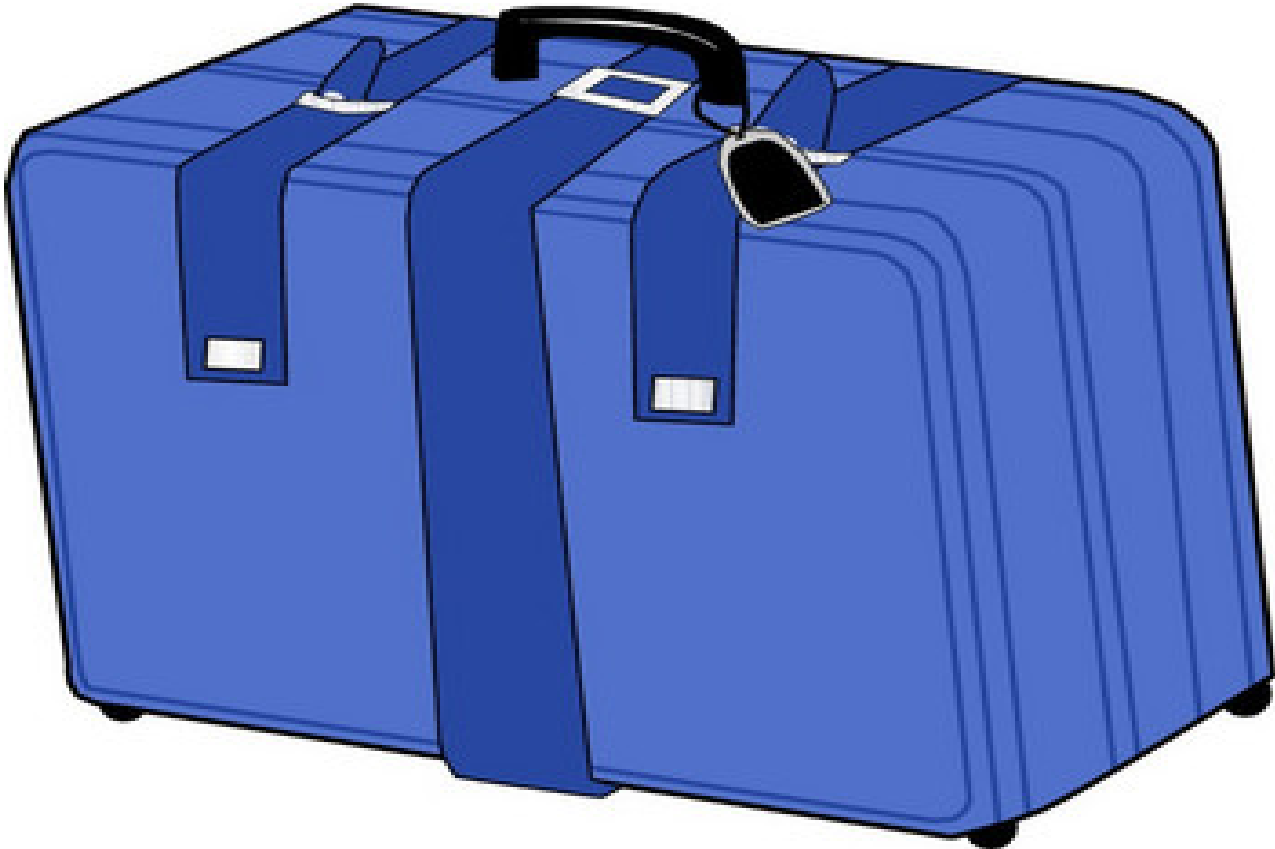

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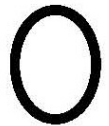

The Friendship Door





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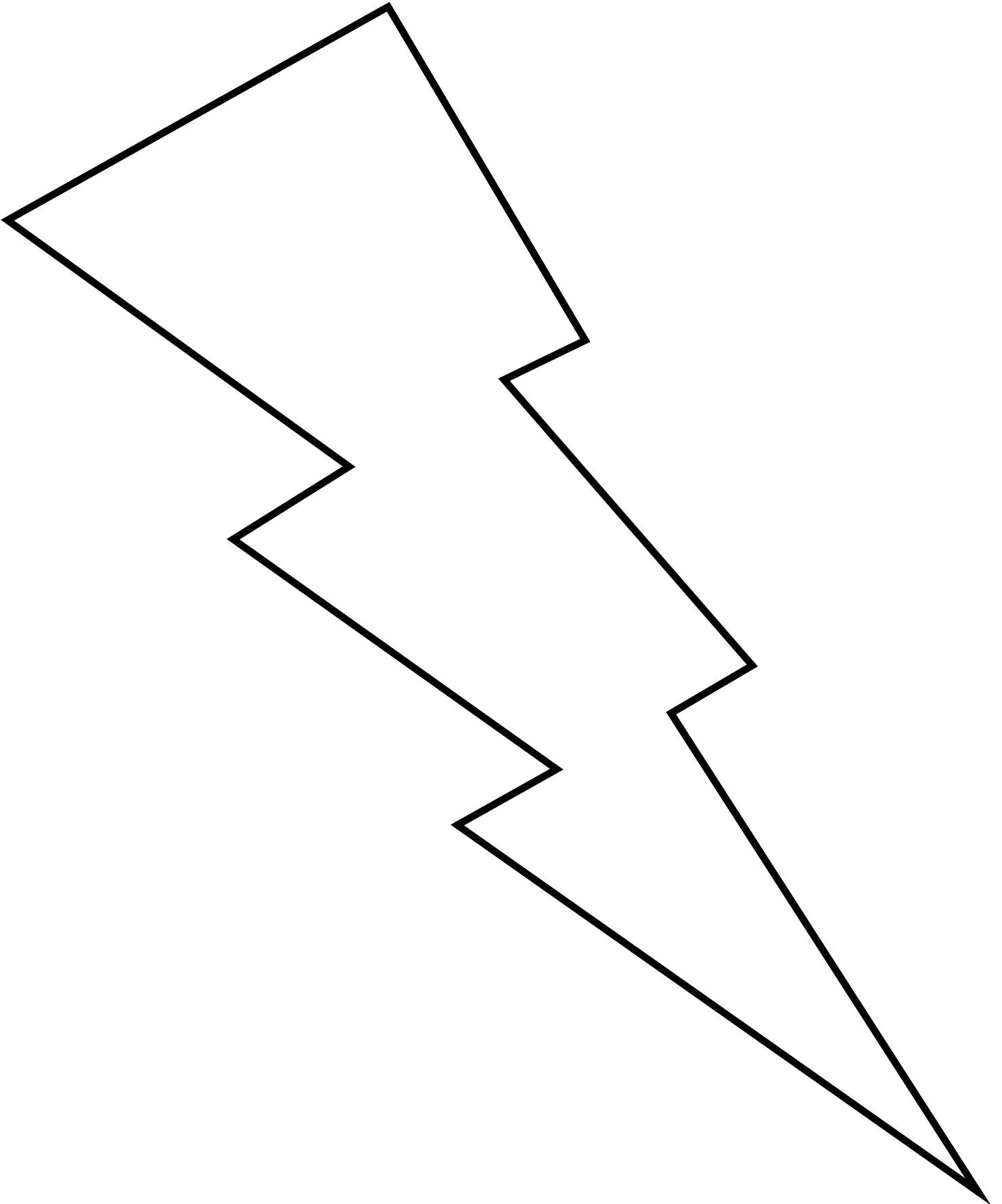
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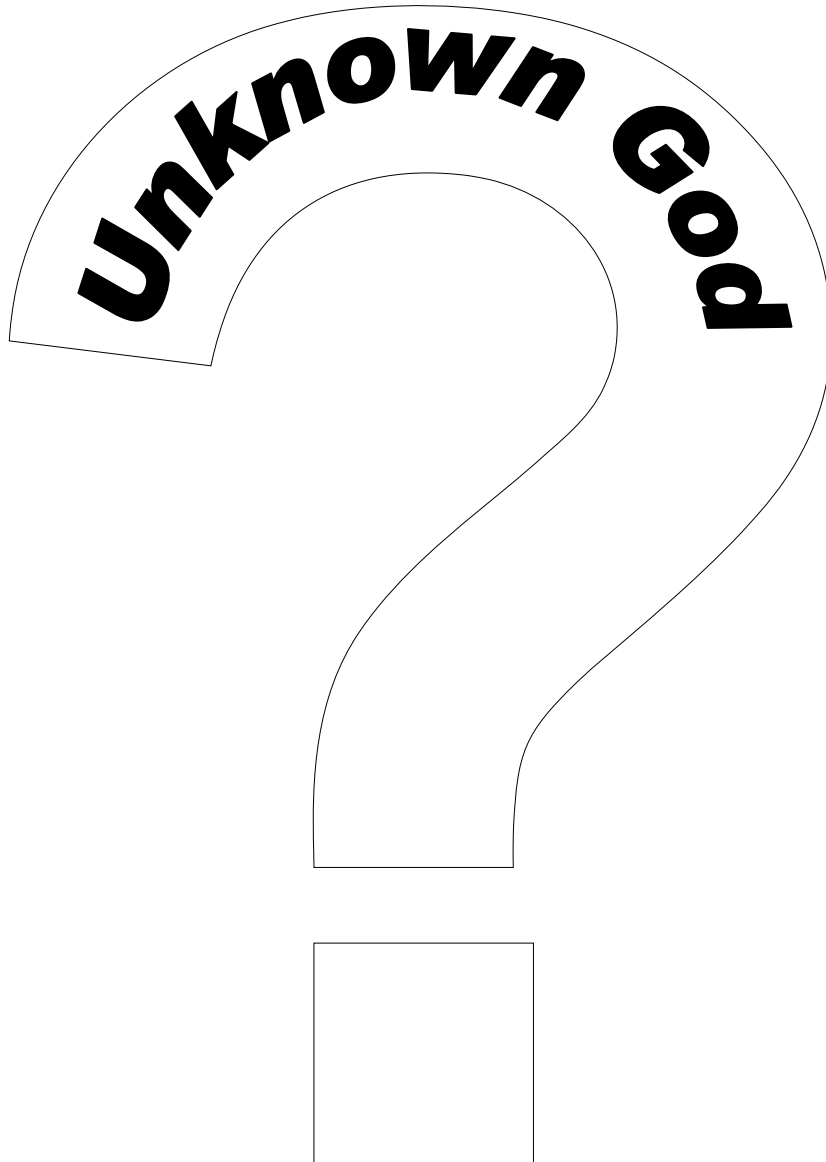


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Religions: Are They All the Same?

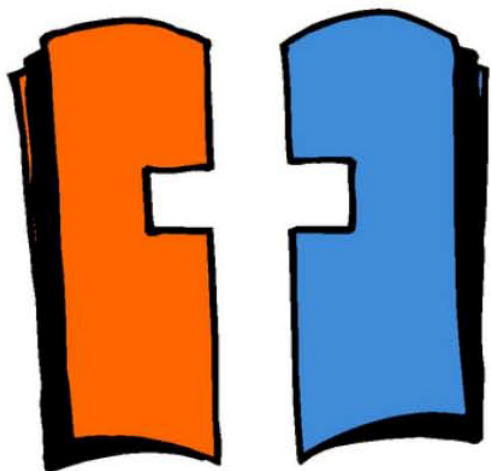

God, the Father	There is one God in three persons. The title of God often refers to God the Father who created all things and is personally involved with people. He loves us all.	God is called Allah.
